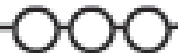




Party Time

- Crisps come in multipacks with 3 cheese and onion, 3 salt and vinegar and 6 ready salted packets. I buy 12 multipacks. If each packet of crisps is shared between 4 children, how many children can have salt and vinegar? _____

3. Cake

- Each cake can be cut into a maximum of 12 slices. How many cakes will I need to buy for each child to have a slice? _____
- Will there be any left for the teacher? How many slices? _____

4. Combinations

How many possible combinations of food are there if these are the choices? Draw a branching diagram on the back of the sheet to work it out.
